Details of the programme

The first training programme was conducted on 13th April 2023 at WAC Hall, College of nursing, Kanpur. The trainer demonstrated different first aid techniques on the students like Assessment of ABC, General steps of CPR, immobilization techniques while transporting, different types of bandaging like Roller bandage, Triangular Bandage, gauze bandage and types of sling application.

The programme ended with the facilitation of trainers by Memento as a token of gratitude and the certificates were distributed to the students by our Principal ma'am and Secretary sir of Indian Red Cross Society followed by Vote of thanks By Ms. Vibha, student of 1st year B.Sc nursing.

The training programme was highly interactive. Taking up first aid training program provides the students with a great opportunity to acquire knowledge on basic first aid skills and the students were motivated how to act in different types of emergencies.
